




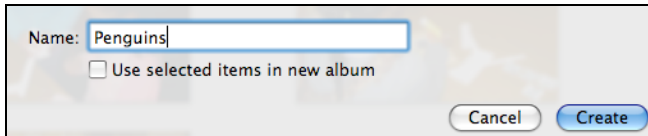
Create a photo book in iPhoto '08

Use iPhoto to create book pages with captions for your photos. You can simply print it on your printer, send the book to Apple to be printed as a hardcover or paperback book, or save the book as a movie for your web page.

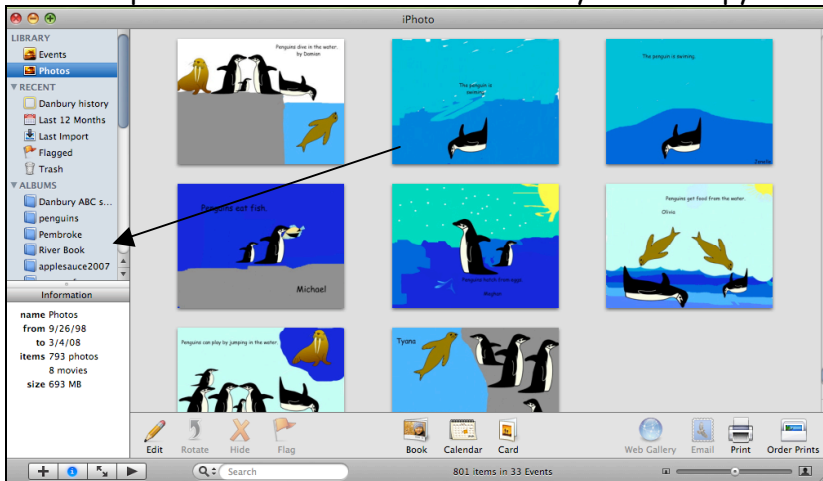
To create a book:

1. Create an album that contains all the photos you wish to use in the book.


- Click on the  at the bottom of the screen to create an album.
- Give the album a title that reflects what it is about, then press Create.



- Click on the Library (photos) to see all your photos.
- Drag the photos you wish to use to the new album. (You can select them all by clicking on the first photo, holding down the shift key, and clicking on last photo. Drag one of the selected photos to the new album and they will all copy to the new album.)



- Click on the new album. All of your selected photos should now be in the new album.

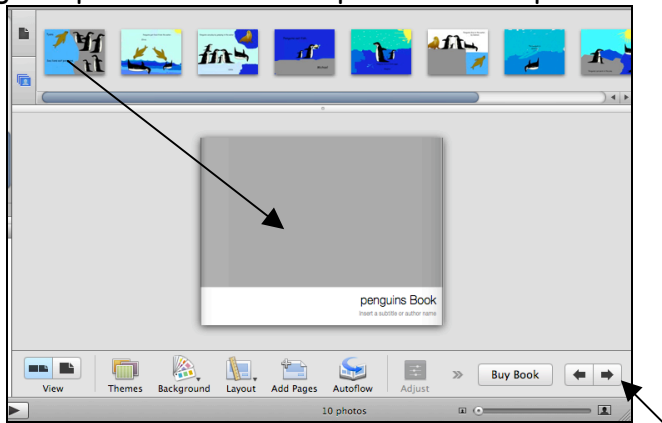
2. At the bottom of the iPhoto window, click on  Book to create a new book.

3. Scroll through the many types of books . . . you can add words to all the book layouts, so pick a book layout that has the kind of photo layout you like.

4. *Note: If you plan on sending it to Apple, you must choose a hardcover, softcover, or wirebound softcover book size from the Book Type pop-up menu.




5. Drag the photos from the top bar into the photo area of the book page.

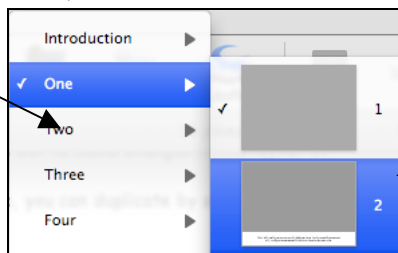


6. Use the right arrow button to go to the next page.

7. To change the number of photos on a page, click on the page you wish to edit, and use the

layout button  in the tool bar.

Select the number of photos you want on the page.



Choose a page with no text, or one with text.


8. Continue to drag photos to each page and select the number of photos per page.


*Hint - the iPhoto book is set to have 20 pages. You can add more pages, but you can't have less than 20 pages. When printing your own copy, just tell the printer to print the number of pages you actually want.

9. If you want to use more than one copy of a specific photo, you can duplicate it by selecting the photo in the album and pressing Apple D to duplicate.

10. If you want to see a larger version of the page (to help you see the words you are typing), use the slider bar to enlarge the page.



11. Select Background  to change the color of the background on the page.

12. Select Settings  to change font styles and sizes.

13. The iPhoto book automatically saves as you create it.

14. To Print, use Apple P or go to the File Menu and select Print.

Tip: If you make a mistake, use Apple Z to undo the last action.

To create a movie of the book:

- To make a movie that includes the text of the book, go to the Share Menu and select send to iDVD.
- The movie of the book will save into your movies folder.
- You can then use the movie on your web page, or simply show it on your classroom computer during Open House.

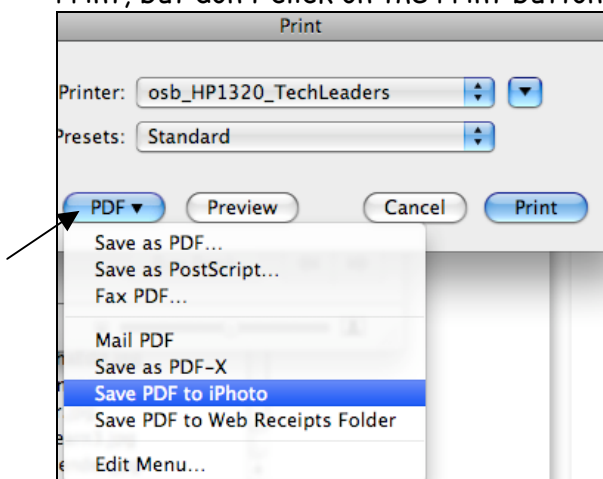
To put your book on the web (as a printable book):

Remember that you do not want to publish full-faced photos of students on the web or include students who do not have permission to be on the web. Check the AUP carefully!

1. Make a PDF of the book (a format that any computer can read.) From the File Menu, select Print, but don't click on the Print button. Instead, select Save to PDF. (see illustration below)
2. It will make set of pages that can be linked on your web site as a printable book. In iWeb, use the Hyperlink Inspector > Link to a File to link to the pdf book.

To put your book on the web (as individual images on the iWeb photo page):

1. Make a PDF of the book (a format that any computer can read.) From the File Menu, select Print, but don't click on the Print button. Instead, select Save PDF in iPhoto.



2. This process will take a "photo" of each book page and save it back into iPhoto as separate photographs. It takes awhile, so be patient!
3. Open iWeb and create a photo page. Drag each photo page of the book from the Media/photos window onto the iWeb photo page. Once published to the web, viewers can see each page of the book with the text.
