



Editing Photos in iPhoto

While iPhoto isn't a full featured photo editing program, it does allow you to make simple edits to enhance the photos.



To edit photos, double click on the photo to show it full size in the window. Click on Edit to make changes. Click Done to keep the changes.

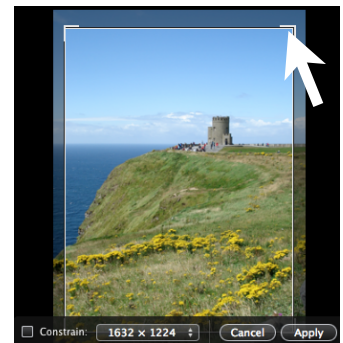


Rotate: Turns the photo in 90-degree increments.

Crop: Trim the photo down to the area of the photo you wish to keep.

- Drag the handles diagonally to highlight the area to keep.
- Click Apply

Straighten: Allows you to rotate the photo up to 10 degrees in either direction.



Enhance: Instantly brightens the photo or adjusts its contrast levels based on preset criteria.



Red-Eye:

- Click on the red eye icon.
- Click on the eye to remove the red. Command- Z to undo if you need to try again.

Retouch: Removes blemishes by blending them into the background.



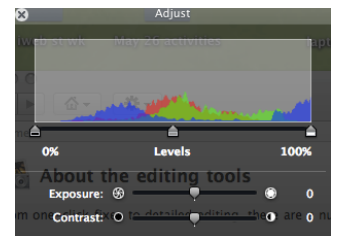
Effects:

Change to black and white, sepia, fade, mat with a circle.

Adjust: Provides tools for advanced editing, such as exposure and contrast, highlights and shadows, color saturation, temperature, or tint, sharpness, noise reduction, and color balance.

Done: Saves changes; leaves edit view and returns to previous view.

Arrows: Saves changes; moves to previous or next photo.



Size slider: See photos in a smaller or larger view.
